She was always known as a daddy's girl, made friends easily and loved to visit elders. Jenny spoke fluent Lakota which was taught to her by her loving grandparents, Raymond and Mae (One Skunk) Brown Thunder. One thing she really liked to do was give nick names, even as she became an adult. Jenny attended school in Cherry Creek and Eagle Butte. From there she went to Clearfield Utah Job Corps and Weber Basin where she received her diploma.

Jenny worked as an admissions clerk while at Weber Basin. While in Utah she met Pete Solis, and in 1987, they had one daughter, Amethyst. Jenny and Amethyst moved to Rapid City. Jenny started working for Doctor Ness at Sioux San as a receptionist. Later she moved to the Belle Fourche/Spearfish area. She and Elberta would travel back and forth to Eagle Butte for visits until she was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2016. Jenny remained close to Rapid City Cancer Care for treatments, living in Lead with her daughter, Amethyst. Jenny entered the Belle Fourche Healthcare Community for comfort care only two weeks prior to passing into God's hands.
