Lyle Maynard was born in Dupree, SD on July 28, 1938 to Edwin and Eulalah Maynard. He was the 2nd of 4 children, brothers Gene and Ralph and sister Bernice. Lyle grew up and completed Kindergarten through 8th grade in Dupree. The family then moved to Deadwood, SD where Lyle completed high school and received his diploma in 1958.

During high school Lyle competed in track and field, basketball, football, and rodeo. Lyle worked for Fred Maynard's Service Station and drove a bright yellow car that was nick-named "Banana Boat". Lyle and his friends often raced their cars between Sturgis and Deadwood. Many times authorities would wait at Fred and Mary's for him due to the cars roaring glasspacks. A week before graduation Lyle broke his leg at a rodeo, but still managed to walk to the stage and receive his diploma.

On October 15, 1960, Lyle married the love of his life, Patsy Annis, at the United Church of Christ in Rapid City, SD. To this union four children were born; Halley, Del, Kris, and Beau. Years later, Hunka brother, Gary Cudmore, joined the family. They lived in Rapid City for a short time while Patsy attended the National College of Business and Lyle worked at the Missile Site in Hermosa. They then moved to Denver, CO for a few years while Lyle worked construction for Dave Nelson. Lyle, Patsy, and family eventually settled on their ranch along the Cheyenne River near Cherry Creek, SD. Lyle worked for Bud and Melissa Annis, cowboying during the day, riding broncs and team roping in the evenings. Bud would sometimes sit with Lyle and discuss how different horses bucked and the best strategies for riding them. Bud encouraged Lyle to enter as many rodeos as he wanted on the weekend, but was always expected to back on the ranch working during the week. Lyle and Patsy traveled all over the US to rodeos, but because of their young family, he kept most of his rodeoing close to home.

One of Lyle's favorite bronc riding stories was when he rode Halley Merrill's great bronc "Big Red". Big Red hadn't been ridden for two years. Lyle drew the horse at a previous rodeo but bucked off. Lyle drew Big Red again in Faith, SD. After Lyle covered the bronc, one of his long-time rodeo buddies, Barry Barber, asked him how he managed a successful ride. Lyle held his fist up and said, "This is how much slack I left in that cinch!" Among many other rodeo accomplishments, Lyle won the 1963 NRCA Saddle Bronc Riding, 1963 SDRA Saddle Bronc Riding, and the 1966 SDRA Saddle Bronc Riding. Lyle's involvement in rodeo continued on throughout his life. He always helped young bronc riders set their saddles, many of whom went on to become champions themselves. Lyle helped with the stock contracting of many rodeos throughout the Midwest. He judged bronc riding and flagged team roping at many GPIRA rodeos. Lyle and Patsy supported and promoted countless local events. Lyle also made sure his own children had every opportunity possible to participate in rodeo as well.

Lyle, Patsy, and family spent many happy years on the ranch at the river. As his kids grew up and became more active in sports, Lyle made sure he was always there to watch and support them. After Patsy passed and his children were all grown, Lyle continued to love and support his grandkids and great-grandkids. Always wanting to know how they were and checking on them. Especially, Eulayla Rose who spent so much time with him. He thoroughly enjoyed his family, horses, cattle, fishing, hunting, and visiting with whoever had time. Lyle raised many good horses, with a great story to accompany them. Eventually, he traded his saddle horse for a four wheeler. Lyle continued to ranch until the Fall of 2018, when he moved to Medicine Wheel Village in Eagle Butte.

Lyle passed peacefully on January 31, 2019. Lyle was preceded in death by his beautiful wife Patsy, his parents Edwin and Eulalah Maynard, and sister Bernice.
