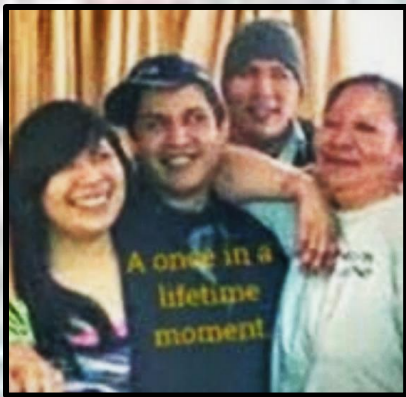




To Those I Love And Those Who Love Me
