Mickey Lyle "Mick" White Feather was born on July 27, 1959, to Lamont and Virginia (Eagle Chasing) White Feather in Faith, SD but grew up in Cherry Creek, SD. Mick's Lakota Name is "Zuya Tokahe" (First Star In War) which was given to him by his dad. The ceremony was performed by Lalas Frank Waloke and James "Deafy" Eagle Chasing. Mick was a Full-Blooded Lakota Sioux who was enrolled in the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe and is a member of the Mnicoujou Band. Mick was proud to be from the Bear Claw Clan.

Mick attended school in Cherry Creek up until the third grade. The family then moved to Dupree, SD where he attended Dupree School, graduating in 1977. (GO TIGERS!) While attending Dupree School, Mick participated in extracurricular activities such as basketball, track, football and rodeo. After high school, Mick furthered his education by attending college in Springfield, SD (1977) and later transferred to Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD (1978). After attending college, he began his employment career.

Mick loved being a heavy equipment operator. He enjoyed traveling from job site to job site and meeting new people while staying in touch with the friends he already knew. He worked at the following places: Federal Building in Aberdeen, SD, CRST Property & Supply, Cheyenne River Construction, he helped Construct the Cheyenne River Community College back in the day, he helped construct many dams and roads, he sold cars and did pest control for Rod Antiz in Rapid City, he worked for the Forest Service up in the mountains in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He worked a total of 40 years for the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe from July 1980 to July 2020.

Mick participated in many sports but grew to love playing and coaching Fast Pitch. He got to coach his sister Robyn Claymore's fast pitch team in Aberdeen, SD. He just loved telling his stories when he coached these young ladies. He also loved playing fast pitch. He would go to many fast pitch tournaments and would tell his stories of these as well. Recently, he fell in love with Indian Horse Relays. Every year during the CRST Annual Fair, he would attend the Indian Horse Relays. Another fun activity he enjoyed was watching "Tik Tok" and "Facebook". His nephew Tyson helped set up apps on his cell phone. Once he learned how to download an app, lookout for he would download many more.

Mick was a cool dude. The words "I love you" was not common growing up, but we learned to say it to each other. Soon, these three valuable words that anyone would love to hear, "I love you" became common. He loved to joke and laugh. He always had a story to tell, and it was awesome to listen to him while he told these stories. He enjoyed talking his native language, Lakota. He was always willing to teach the language. Takoja Lamont would ask him words and he would tell him. It was nice that he was passing the language down to the younger generation. Mick will truly be missed by all! Toksa Ake Wacinyakinkte (I'll see you again).

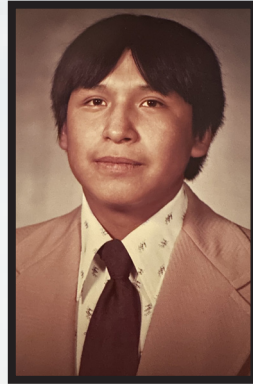
