We would not make him stay.*





Ben Hushka, 88, of Faulkton, passed away, Sunday, February 3, 2013 at Avera St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen.

Benjamin Frank was born February 8, 1924 to Joseph and Katie (Steier) Hushka on a farm near Dickinson, North Dakota. He was raised on the family farm. For a brief time, Ben traveled from the family farm and worked in Detroit, Michigan. He returned to North Dakota and worked in the grain elevator business for nearly 50 years. On November 16, 1948, in a double wedding ceremony with his sister

Barb and Melvin Kaufman, Ben married Josephine "Jo" Paluck. Ben and Jo lived in Wilton, North Dakota with Ben's parents and assisted in operating a café and rooming house.
