*Robert Wieseler*, 78, of Orient, passed away Sunday, June 1, 2014 at Avera St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen, surrounded by the love of his wife, children and grandchildren.

Robert Wieseler was born June 2, 1935 to Joe and Susan (Bartholomew) Wieseler at Miller, SD. He was the youngest of five children and grew up on the family farm 8 ½ miles southwest of Orient. He attended Park Country Rural School all eight grades with the exception of the third grade when he boarded and attended St. Liborius Catholic School. He went on to attend four years of high school at St. Liborius in Polo from which he graduated from in 1953.

Robert's love for baseball carried him all the way through high school and even some years after marriage.

He then met his future bride at a roller-skating Party in Orient in 1955. On October 15, 1957 he married Virginia Alice Baloun at St. Boniface Catholic Church in Seneca, SD.
