Ronald Sangster, 72, of Faulkton, died Tuesday, February 24, 2015 at Avera St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen.

Ronald Glen Sangster was born April 24, 1942 to Glen and June (Halter) Sangster at Cresbard, SD. He attended O'Neil Country School and graduated from Faulkton High School in 1961.

Following high school Ron worked for Bob Schilder and Texaco before moving to Denver, CO where he worked for a company that A.I. cattle. In 1966 he returned to Faulkton and went to work for Faulkton Elevator and Schwan's. In December 1984 Ron went to work for the City of Faulkton, later becoming City Public Works Manager. He retired in January 2008.
