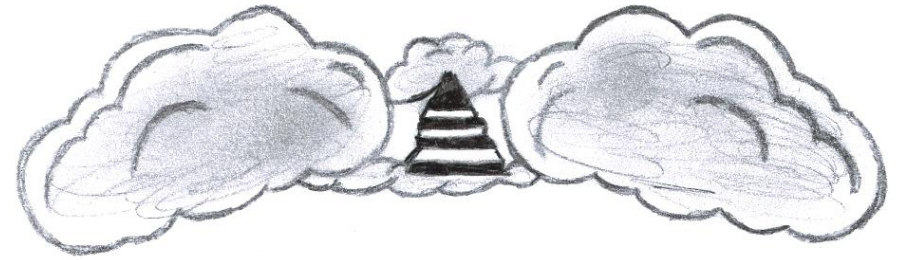
Russell “Russ” Geist, 44, of Faulkton, passed away Wednesday, January 27, 2016 at his home.
