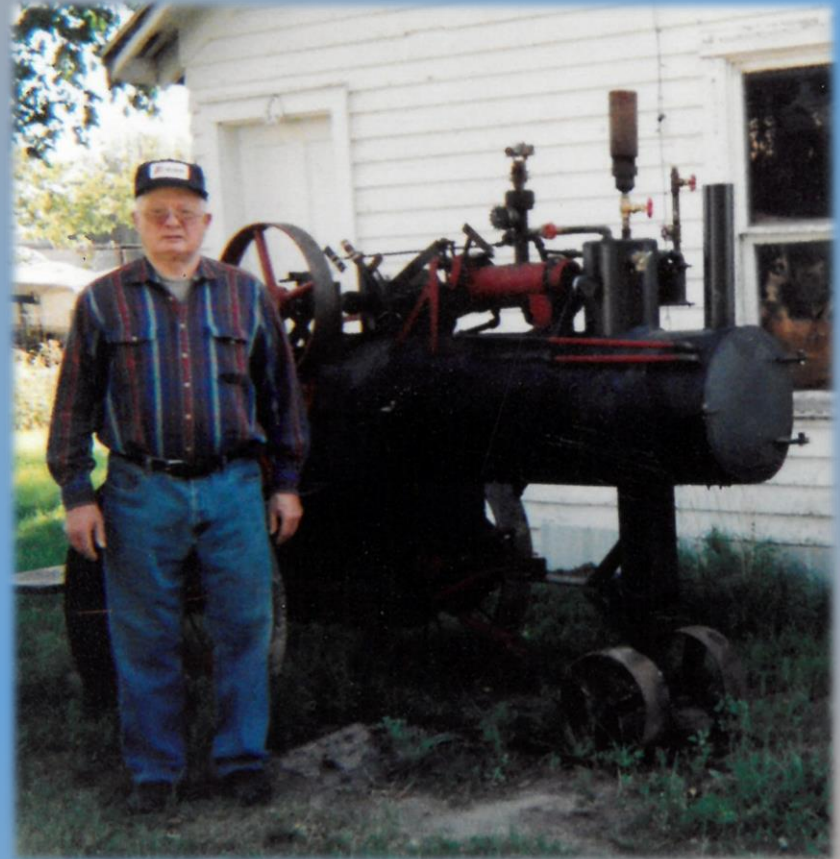

In February 1956, Marvin enlisted in the United State Army. He served in Germany and was honorably discharged in January of 1958.

Upon his return from the service, Marvin worked with farmers and ran a repair shop at the Weyand farm. In 1982 he opened Weyand Repair in town, operating until his health forced him to slow down.

In Marvin's free time he enjoyed welding, making steam engines, working with metal, spending time with his family and staying active.
