Richard “Dick” G. Weyand, 93, of Faulkton, passed away Saturday, March 11, 2023, at Faulkton Senior Living.

Richard Gerald Weyand was born January 5, 1930, in Faulk County, SD, to Oscar and Clarice (Hall) Weyand. He graduated from Faulkton High School in 1948.

After high school, Dick entered the United States Army, serving as a radar mechanic. Following his honorable discharge, he returned to Faulkton to work alongside his father on the family farm. He later bought the Albert Kleeblatt farm. Dick spent years working the land, raising Chianus cattle and thoroughly loving all that farming brought to his life.

Faith was a huge part of Dick’s life. He was a lifetime member of the United Church of Faulkton and gave freely of his time as a Sunday School teacher and helping others get to Sunday services.
