Avis Schilder was born November 26, 1923, in Grinnell, Iowa to Harry and Velma (Gooding) Schilder. At the age of 14, she moved with her family to a farm west of Burkmere, SD then to a farm near Norbeck, SD. She attended country school, graduating from Cresbard High School in 1941. Avis got her RN degree from St. Luke's Nurses Training in 1944. She went to basic training from the Army Nurses Corp in 1945 in Colorado Springs, CO. Avis spent three years at Fitzsimmons General Hospital in Denver. After her military discharge in 1948, she moved back to the Norbeck family farm.

Avis reunited with her high school classmate, Orval Niederbaumer. They were married on October 16, 1948. She continued working part time at the Faulkton Hospital while helping Orval farm. Avis retired from nursing in 1982.
