Lyle was born August 6, 1922 in Tolstoy, SD at the family home in Springs Community to Edward and Matilda (Dale) Griese. Throughout his childhood, Lyle worked on the family farm and grew to love farm life. He met Josephine Barondeau while she was working in the Springs Community and they were married April 10, 1944.
