On July 1, 1942 Harold was inducted into the United States Army, serving during WWII in the European Theater. He was honorably discharged November 25, 1945 having received five battle stars.

Harold returned to Gettysburg. He married Neola Genzler in 1947. They had three children together and later divorced. He then married Millie Tin Cup in 1963 and they also had three children and were later divorced.

When Harold returned from the service he farmed for five years before moving to Aberdeen where he worked in a freight warehouse. He returned to Gettysburg working for numerous area farmers and also spent early mornings driving to Bowdle to get the Aberdeen American News for the Gettysburg Community and driving weekly to Moberg for Jack Stoner with the Potter County News. Harold retired in 1986.

Harold enjoyed fishing, camping, playing cards, tinkering with cars and visiting with family and friends. He was a member of the Medicine Rock Senior Center, VFW and American Legion.


