Irene Hamburger, 88, of rural Seneca, passed away Monday, February 18, 2013 at Dougherty Hospice House, Sioux Falls, SD.

Irene's life was a testimony to the Lord Jesus Christ. She spent time daily in prayer and devotions and faithfully served at Grace Bible Church. She was active in the Sunday School and Awana Program for many years.
