Dennis Jost was born July 29, 1935 to A. Ben and Oralle (Rowse) Jost in Lebanon, SD. He attended country school and graduated in 1953 from Gettysburg High School.

Denny went to work on the family farm with his father, eventually renting his own farm land. On August 9, 1958 he was united in marriage to Sola Pearson in Agar. They made their home in the Lebanon area where Denny continued to farm. He also managed Bob's Steakhouse prior to him getting in to the plumbing business. He worked for a short time for Duane Comeau and Roy Nold prior to going out on his own.

In 1977 Denny started his own plumbing and backhoe business and moved his family to Agar where he remained the rest of his life.

Denny's life revolved around country music and his family. He was a self taught musician who spent many years in a band providing music at local establishments and barn dances.
