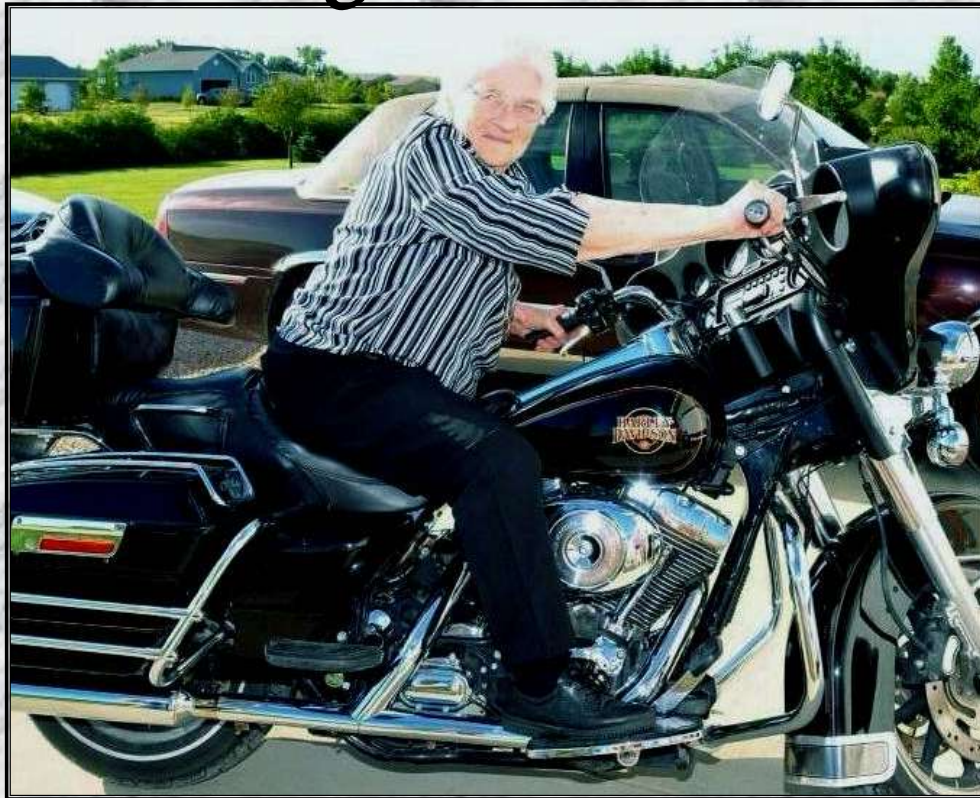


# Granny T
