Jeanne Heath, 90, of Gettysburg, passed away Thursday, September 10, 2015 at the Avera Oahe Manor, Gettysburg.

Jeanne Maltaverne was born January 25, 1925 in Gettysburg, SD to Leon & Germaine (Rogissard) Maltaverne. She attended school in Gettysburg, graduating in 1943.

After high school Jeanne moved to Indianapolis, IN where she worked in an airplane factory. She is what would have been considered a Rosie the Riveter; representing American women who worked in factories during World War II. Jeanne then moved to Sioux City, IA where she attended Cosmetology School. She worked in Sioux City until marrying Robert "Bernie" Heath on June 16, 1947. They moved back to South Dakota in 1948 where they raised their family, Dennis, Andrea and Jeff. All three of the children served in the service of the United States.
