Jane Rausch, 82, of Gettysburg, passed away Monday, July 25, 2016 at the Avera Dougherty Hospice House in Sioux Falls, surrounded by her family.

Jane Hannigan was born September 15, 1933 in Pierre, SD to Howard and Helen (Ryan) Hannigan. She attended school in Gettysburg graduating from Gettysburg High School in 1951. Throughout her high school years Jane worked at the local "Snack Shack".
