things and done them well

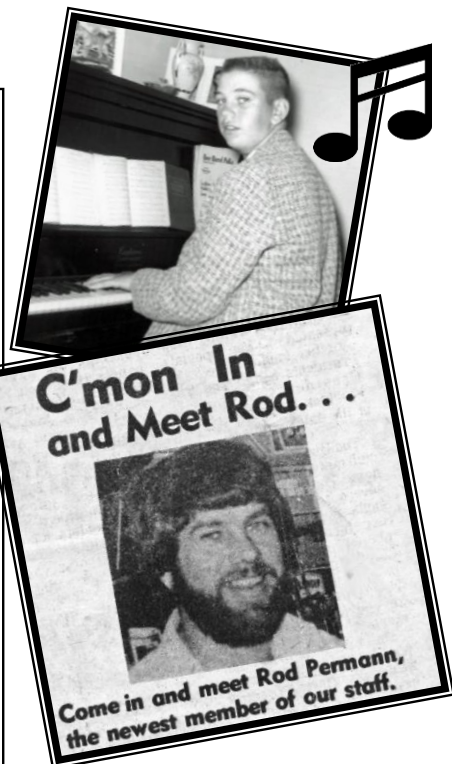
For his friendship - he had so many good
