Richard D. Penrod, 62, of Gettysburg, passed away Wednesday, November 30, 2016 at the Avera Gettysburg Hospital.

Richard Dale Penrod was born August 14, 1954 in Gettysburg to Obert, Jr. and Marilyn (Schaefer) Penrod. He received his education at Gettysburg, graduating in 1972. Rich continued his education at Reisch Auction School at Mason City, IA, graduating in March of 1975.

Rich started his career as a hog farmer before starting his own business: RDP Construction, which he ran for over 20 years and later became a real estate agent. He also spent 41 years as an Auctioneer, always using the saying, "No auction too big...or too small!"
