Roger Alan Joachim, 75, of Agar, passed away Tuesday, November 9, 2021, at Avera St. Mary's Hospital, Pierre.

Roger was born to Oscar W. and Esther (Buechler) Joachim on May 31, 1946, in Gettysburg, SD. Roger attended Agar Elementary and Agar High School, graduating in 1964. While in school he participated in basketball and track. Roger was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church of Agar, where he was baptized, and confirmed on May 25, 1961. In later years his membership was transferred to Emmanuel Church in Gettysburg.

After graduating high school, he entered Joachim's School of Hard Knock's and worked on the family farm. On January 12, 1974, he married Helen Schneider of Rockham, SD, at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Gettysburg, SD, and unfortunately divorced in 1991.
