


Frank had an enjoyable childhood along with his older brother, Gerald and younger sister, Carol. Frank attended Kula School and Gettysburg High School where he excelled at playing football.

Frank served in the US Army from 1955-1957 and was stationed in Germany, where he got his fill of world travel.
