Steve A. Glaesman, 70, of Gettysburg, passed away Monday, January 30, 2023, at Santa Rosa Hospital, New Braunfels, Texas.

Steve was born May 22, 1952, to Alvin E. and Inez (Bader) Glaesman at Ft. Rucker, AL. After his dad was discharged from the military, they moved to Huron, SD where Steve graduated from high school in 1972.

On May 9, 1969, Steve married Mary Hall and to this union two daughters were born. During this time, he worked on construction with Mary's dad.

In 1976, Steve moved to Watertown where he and his dad owned and operated Jimco Ready Mix. After the business closed, he started working road construction and later moved to Gettysburg, SD at South Whitlock Resort so he could enjoy more hunting and fishing.

Steve continued to work road construction until going to work in June of 1995 for CHS as a pellet mill operator. He retired from CHS in April 2016. His greatest joy was his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. He glowed whenever he saw pictures of them.
