**Sharon C. Haverty**, 70, of Aberdeen and formerly of Hoven, passed gently away surrounded by her loved ones on Friday, August 18, 2023, at Avera St. Luke's Hospital, Aberdeen.

Sharon Carol Hageman was born October 4, 1952, to Gillis and Delores (Bertha) Hageman in Hoven, SD. She was raised on the family farm and graduated with the class of 1970. After high school, Sharon attended Mount Marty College, graduating with a degree in respiratory therapy. She then moved to Chattanooga, TN where she was employed by Erlanger Hospital. While in Chattanooga she met and married the love of her life, Martin Haverty in 1978. To this union their daughter, Jennifer Lee, was born in 1979.

In 1983, the family moved back to South Dakota where Sharon was employed at Avera St. Luke's Hospital until the time of her death. She worked as
