Chuck Byrum, 79, of Highmore, passed away Tuesday, March 31, 2015 in Gillette, WY.

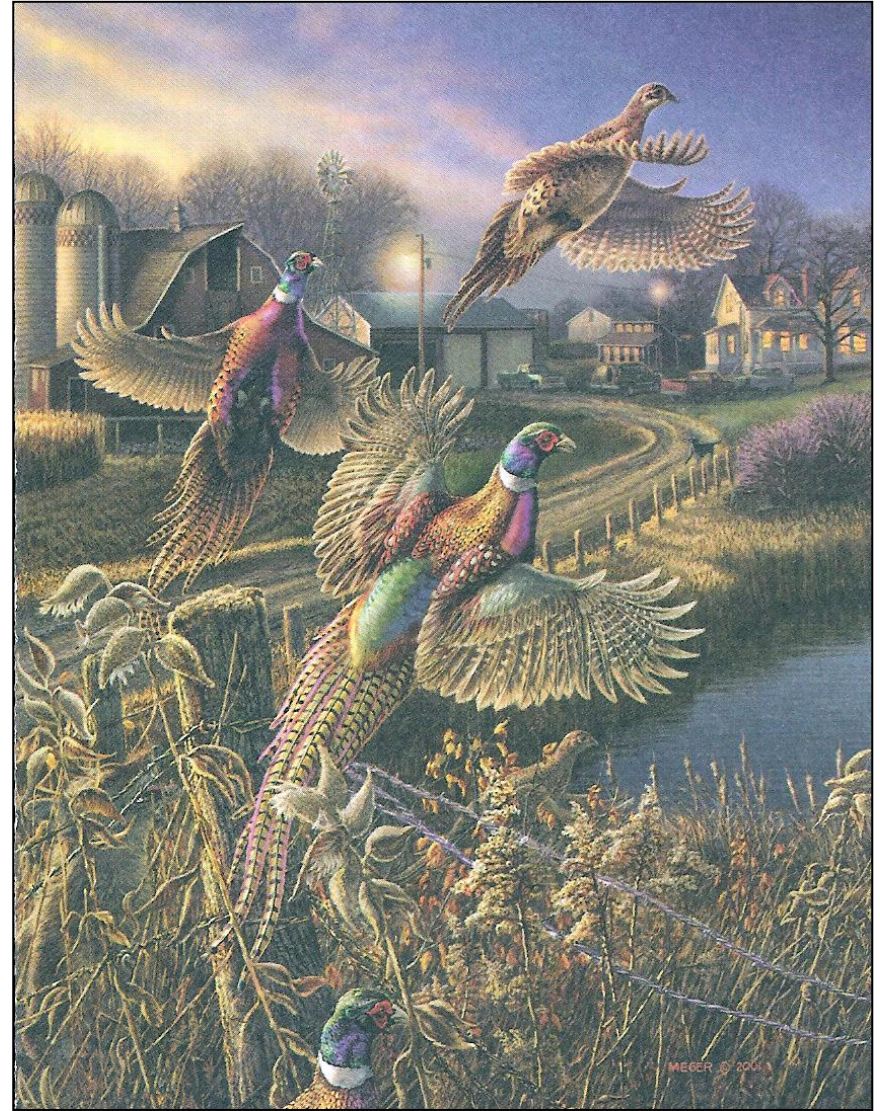
