peace without pain.*

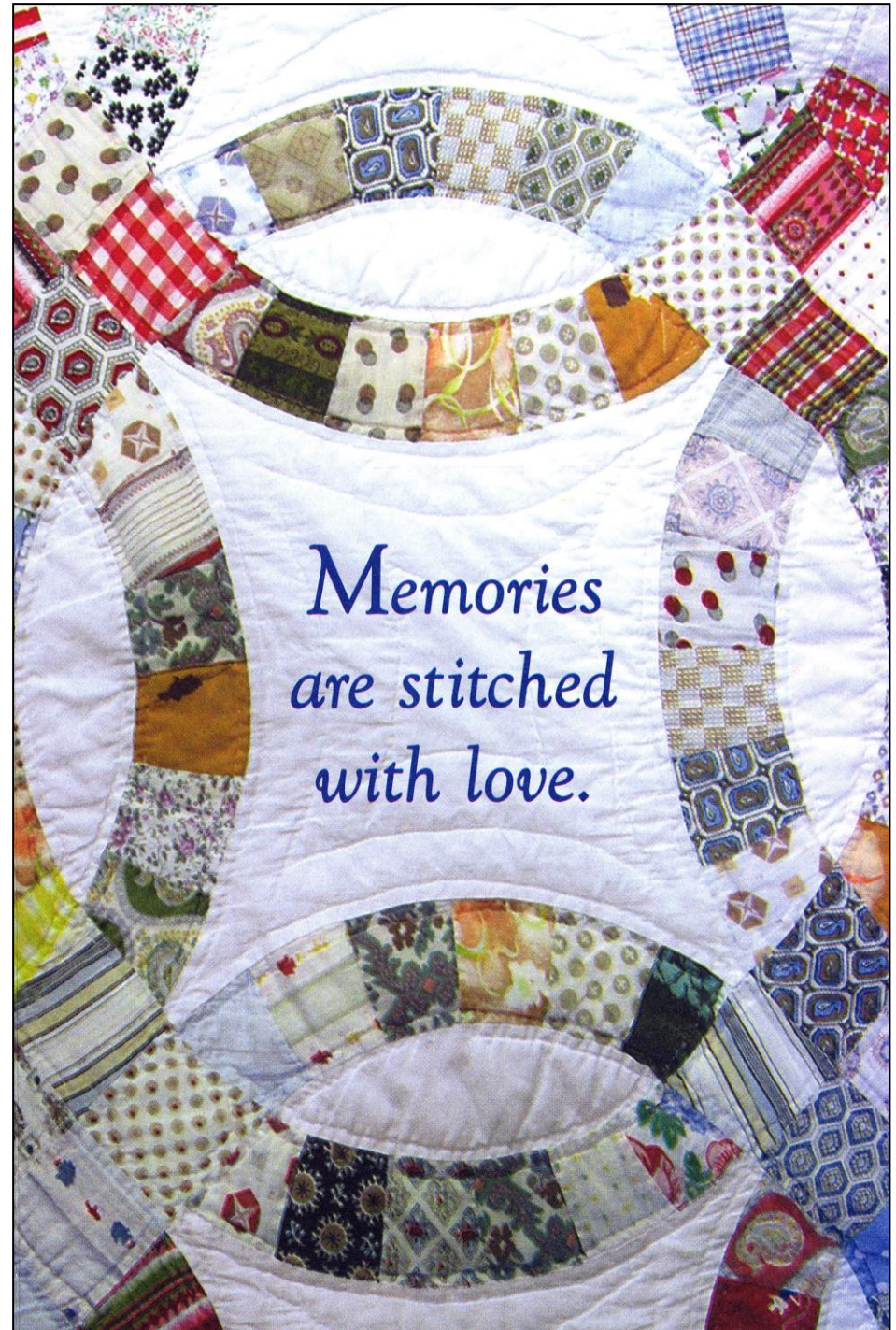
