

If Tears Could Build A Stairway

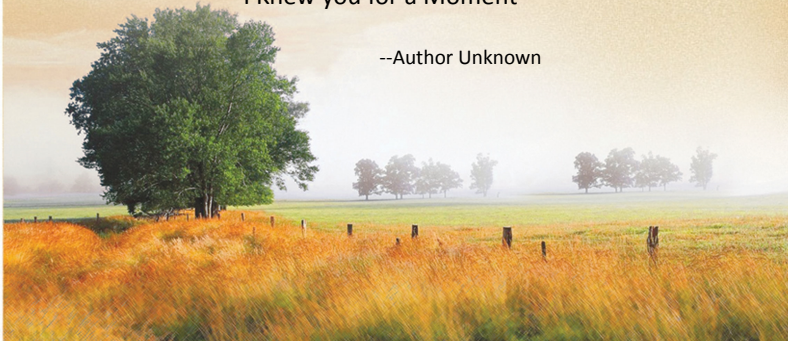
If tears could build a stairway

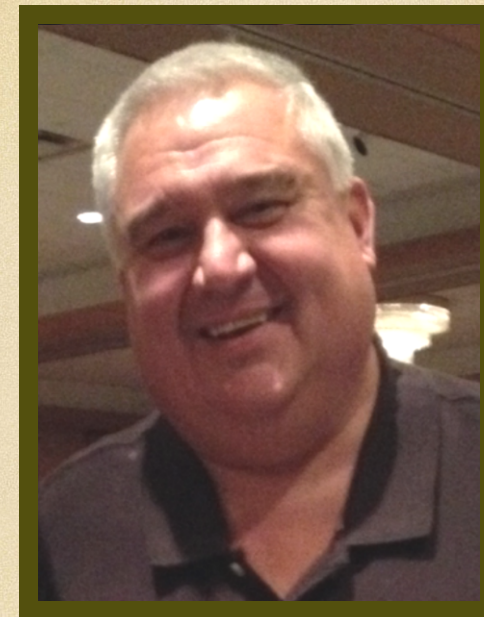

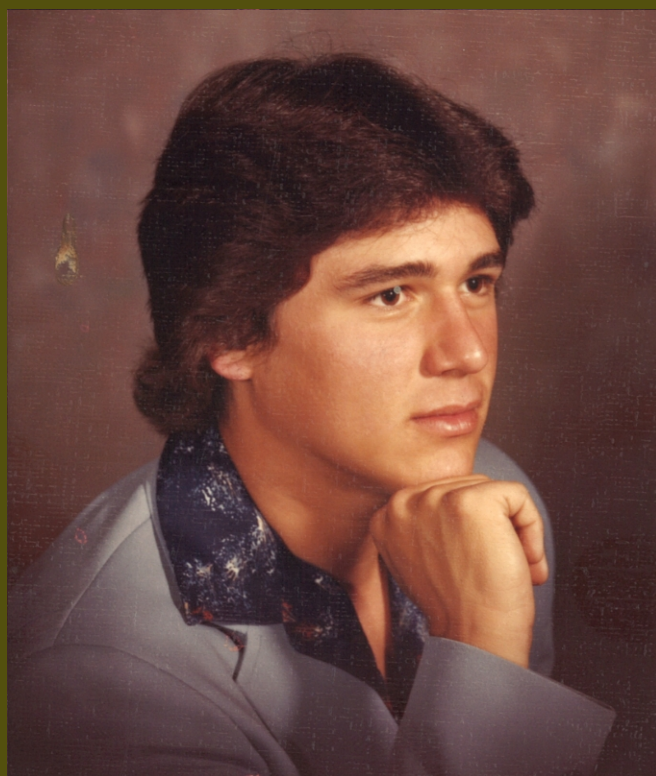
