Marilyn Rinehart, 90, of Highmore, passed away Wednesday, December 27, 2017 at Highmore Health in Highmore.

Marilyn Ann Rinehart was born August 27, 1927 to Otto and Grace (Roseland) Hagenlock in Seneca SD, she went home to be with the Lord December 27, 2017. She grew up on the family farm SE of Seneca SD, attending country school for 8 grades, graduating from Seneca SD high school in 1945 Marilyn lettered in high school in girls' basketball. She attended summer school sessions at Aberdeen SD college majoring in education receiving her teaching certificate. Marilyn taught at Baldwin country school meeting Harold when she was teaching in 1947.

Harold and Marilyn were married on November 3rd, 1948 they lived at Burkmere, SD in 1950 they purchased the McNamara Ranch in NW Hyde county. Marilyn's life was filled with many activities, including teaching Sunday school, and as a 4-H leader.
