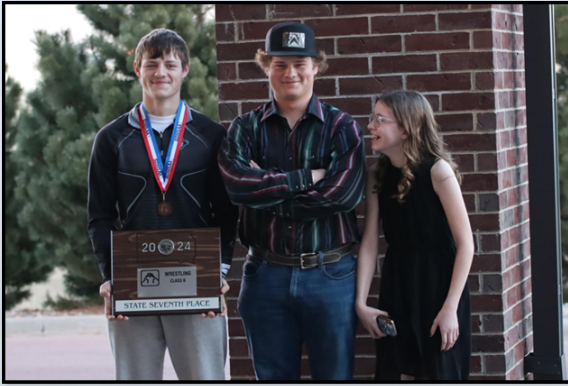

Wyatt Lee Rowland, 17, of Ree Heights, passed away Tuesday, March 12, 2024, in rural Hand County.

Wyatt Lee Rowland was born on February 27, 2007, in Watertown, South Dakota, to Justin Rowland and Sarah Rheinbolt. He attended elementary and high school in Highmore at Highmore-Harrold School.

As a young boy, Wyatt was always active and involved in everything he could be. He played AAU football, wrestled for AAU, and worked on the farm with his dad and grandpa as often as possible.
