Micheal Washechek, 38, of Harrold, passed away from a tragic vehicle accident on Sunday, September 1, 2024, near Fort Thompson.

Micheal (Mikey) Washechek was born on March 27, 1986, at an even 5 lbs., to Michael and Iris (Cables) Washechek. Mikey was born and raised in Huron, SD, where he attended school and graduated in May 2004 as a Huron Tiger.
