Good friends, good times, a love ones touch.

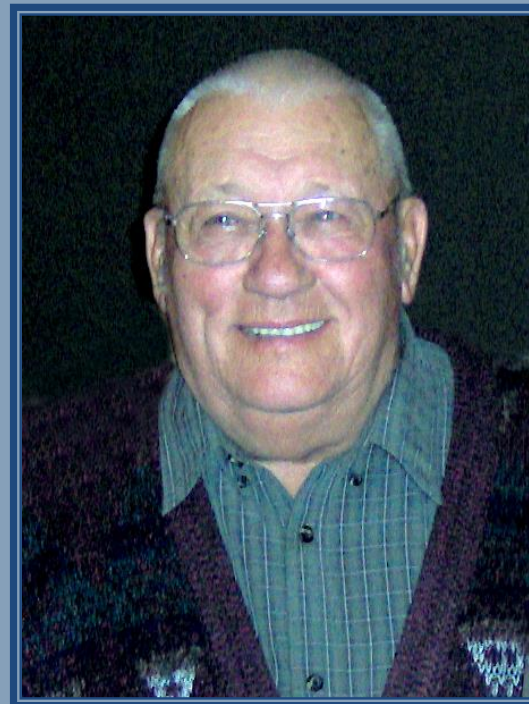
Perhaps my time seemed all too brief,

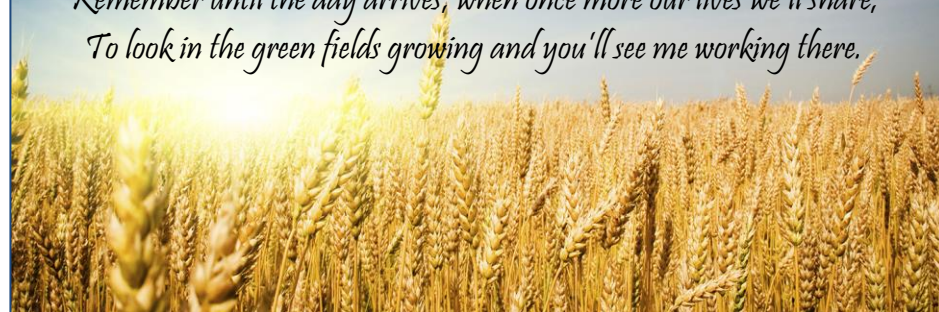

It was not uncommon for him to be in three different towns in one day. He loved visiting with people no matter what age. CW was known as a generous man with great integrity. CW had a smile like no other, he smiled with his heart.

His presence will be deeply missed, especially at the shop, five miles north of Miller.
