You shall rest in Jesus' land.*

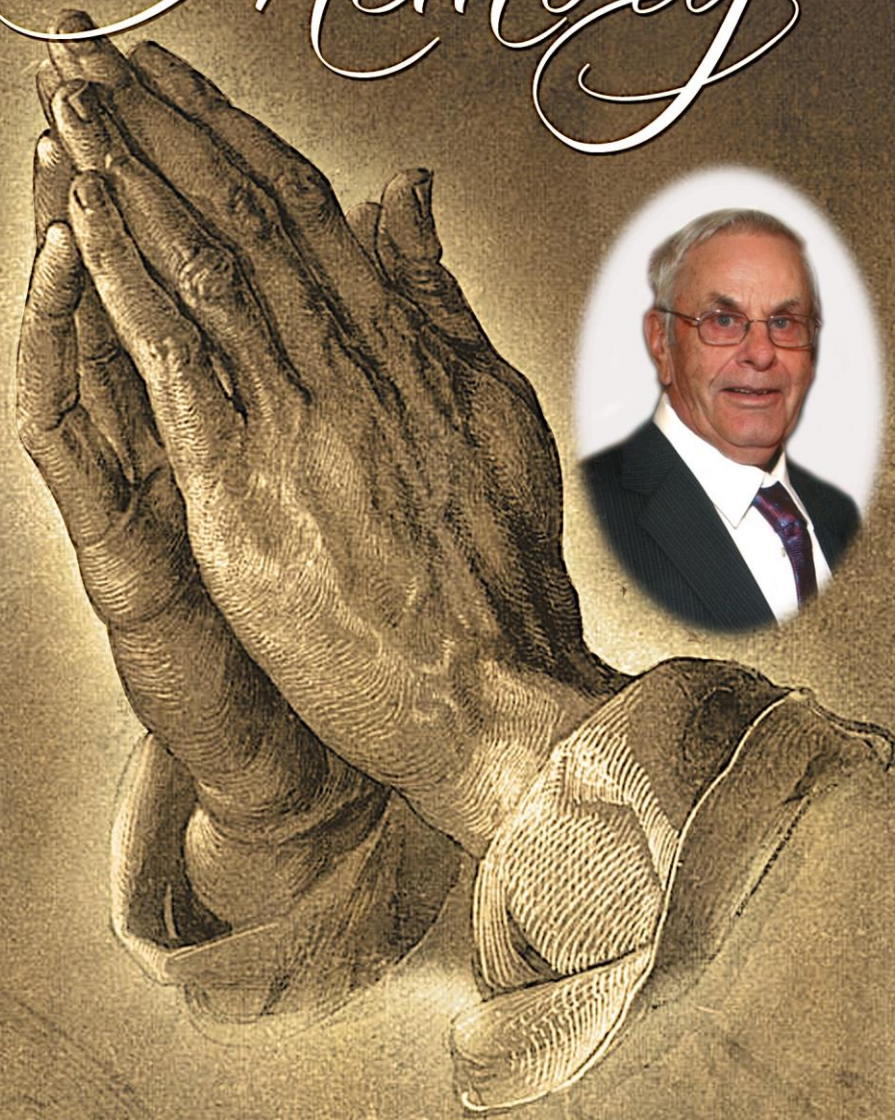
*When that work is all completed,
