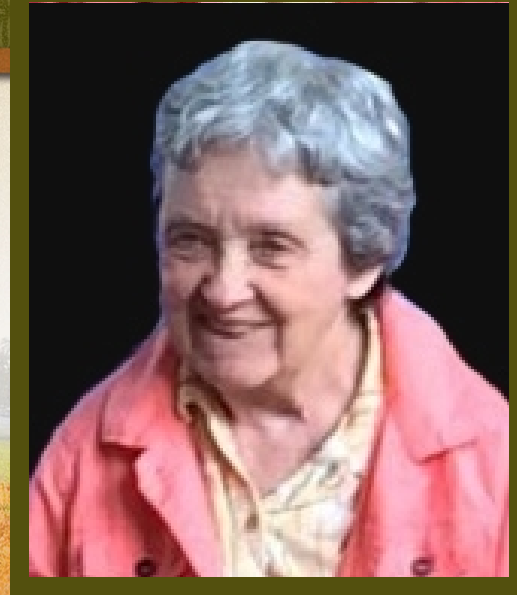


Going Home
