Wayne Moncur, 88, of Miller, passed away Sunday, December 13, 2015 at the Good Samaritan Society, Miller.

Wayne Wallace Moncur was born March 1, 1927, to James R. and Lily M. (Myers) Moncur at the family home in Florence Township, Hand County, Miller, South Dakota. Wayne attended rural school in Florence Township through the eighth grade. His freshman year of high school was spent at Redfield High School, and his last three years at Miller High School, graduating in 1945.

He married Margaret M. Holm on January 15, 1954, at Pierre. They were blessed with five children. Wayne worked as Register of Deeds for Hand County, sold cars for Miller Motor, and was a property manager for Sheldone Reese in Rapid City. In 1960, he returned to the family farm to work with his father and brothers farming and feeding cattle until he retired in 1982. He and Margaret then moved to Miller where he was residing at the time of his death. He served on the Florence Township board for several years.

During his retirement, he enjoyed bowling, taking care of his lawn and garden. He also worked part-time as a bus driver for Good Samaritan Society, a substitute mail carrier and various other jobs in the community. But his greatest enjoyment was spending time visiting with family and friends. He was a lifetime member of the Miller Methodist Church and a member of the St. Lawrence Masonic Lodge for many years.
