as we feel so empty and hold many fears.

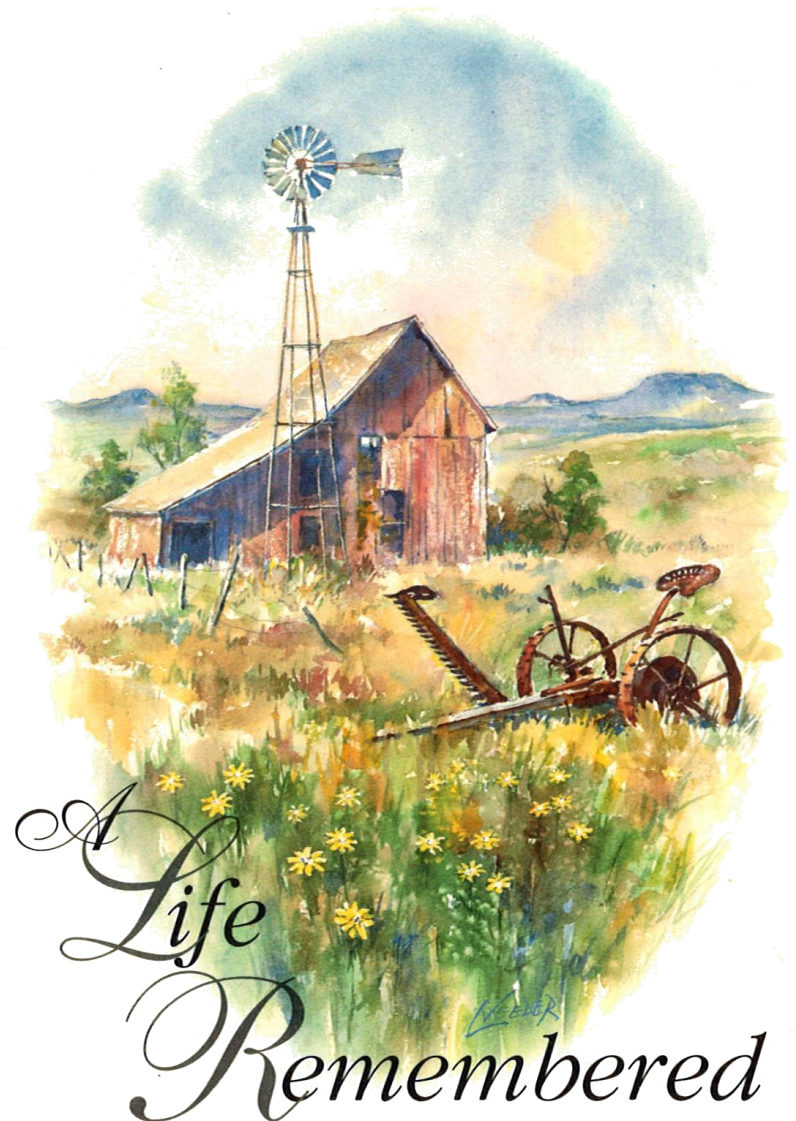
But Grandpa would want us to know he's in a good place
