Remembering THE LIFE OF Duane Lee Robison August 9, 1934 - March 1, 2017





Duane was born on August 9, 1934 in Miller, SD to Lee DeMoss and Laura (Rice) Robison. Duane attended country school in Mondamin Township and graduated from Miller High School in 1952. Upon graduating high school, Duane took over the family farm as his father died suddenly during Duane's senior year. In 1962, Duane married Darlene Willman in Miller. To this union, 3 children were born. They lived on the family farm until 2004 when they retired and built a home in Miller.

Duane was an active member of St. Ann's Catholic Church as well as numerous organizations, including Knights of Columbus, Mondamin Township Board, and the Miller School Board. He was also a member of the Friendship Center where he had numerous hours of enjoyment playing pool with his buddies.
