Their warm and tender touch.

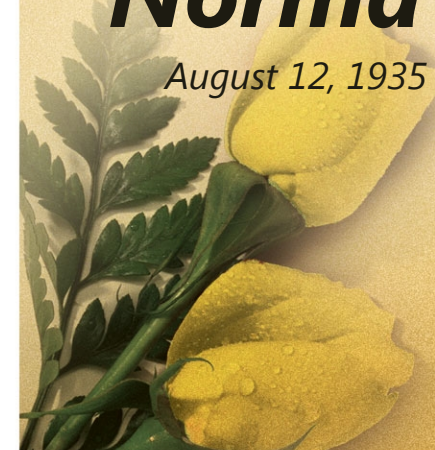
