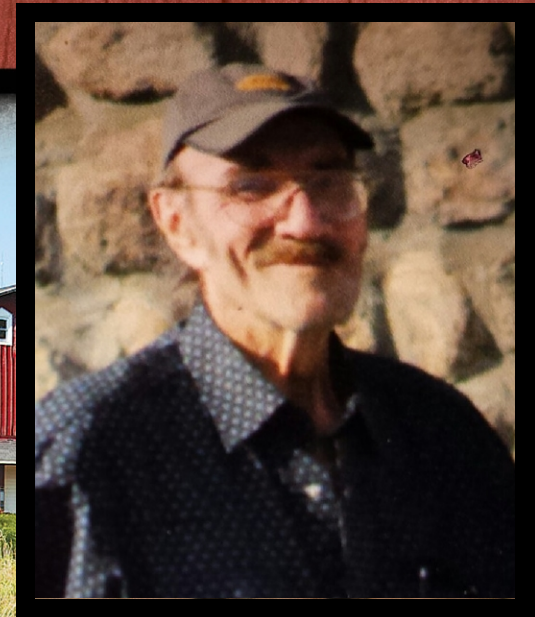


Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free

Bud Johnson, 72, of Miller, passed away Saturday, June 3, 2017 at his home.

Clinton Royce "Bud" Johnson was born August 26, 1944 to Trygve and Edith (Campbell) Johnson, the fourth of eight children. He attended rural school in Hand County and high school in Gann Valley. He was drafted into the Army and was stationed in Germany during the Vietnam Conflict from 1965 to 1967.
