Surely goodness & mercy shall follow me

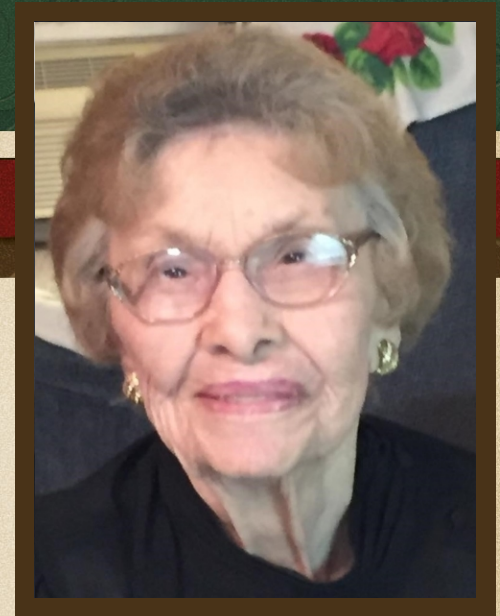
