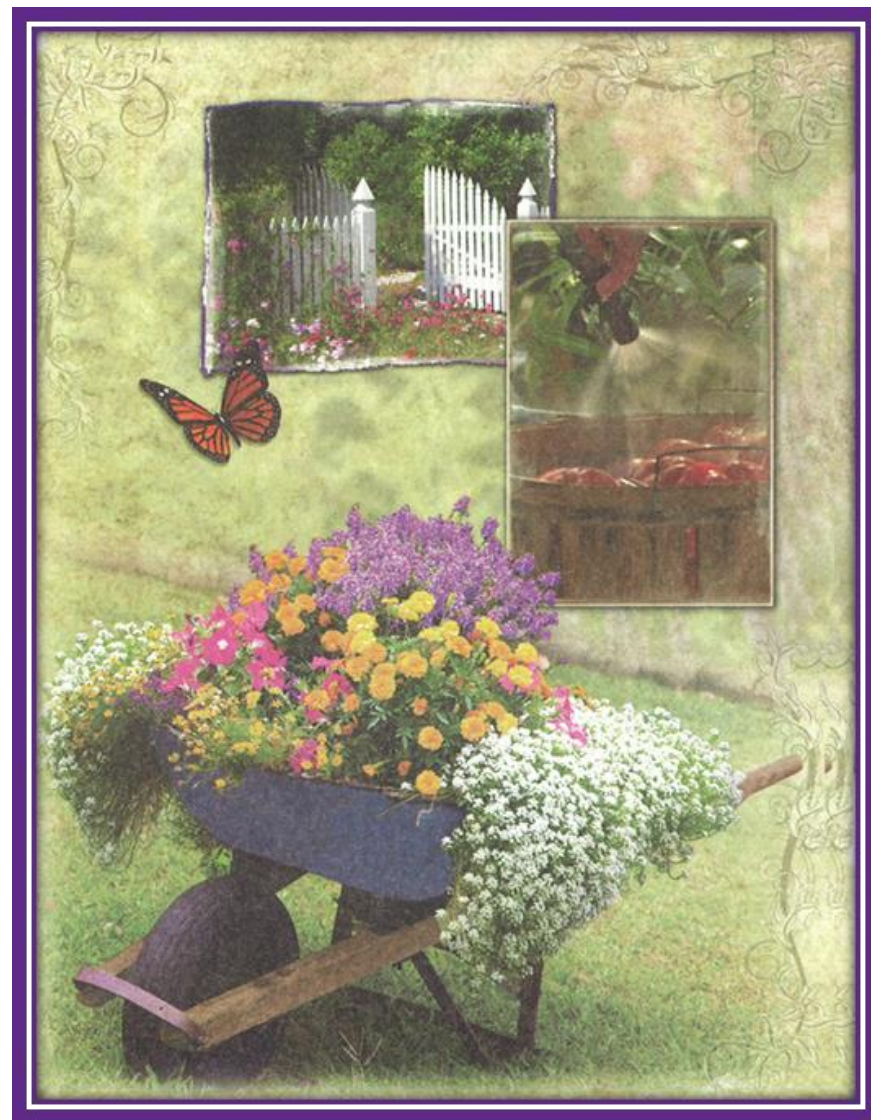


THE FAMILY CHAIN
