

Mom's Sweet Rolls

2 c. hot water	5-6 c. Robin Hood flour
1/3 c. Crisco	1/2 c. lukewarm water
1/3 c. sugar	1 pkg. yeast
2 eggs	sugar & Watkins cinnamon

Put yeast in 1/2 c. of lukewarm water, mix in hot water, shortening, sugar and eggs in large bowl. Add 2 c. flour until smooth. Stir in water and yeast mixture. Add more flour to make dough soft. Knead it. Let rest 10 min. then knead again. Let dough rise, then punch down and let rise again. Flatten dough out and butter the top. Sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon. Roll up and cut into rolls. Spread caramel in bottom of greased pan and lay rolls on top of caramel. Let rise and bake at 375°

Caramel (made for 3 dozen rolls)

2. cups brown sugar	4T. syrup
1 T. vinegar	1/2 c. oleo or butter
4 T. water	1 tsp. Watkins vanilla

Bring all ingredients to a boil.
Can store in refrigerator for one month.
