



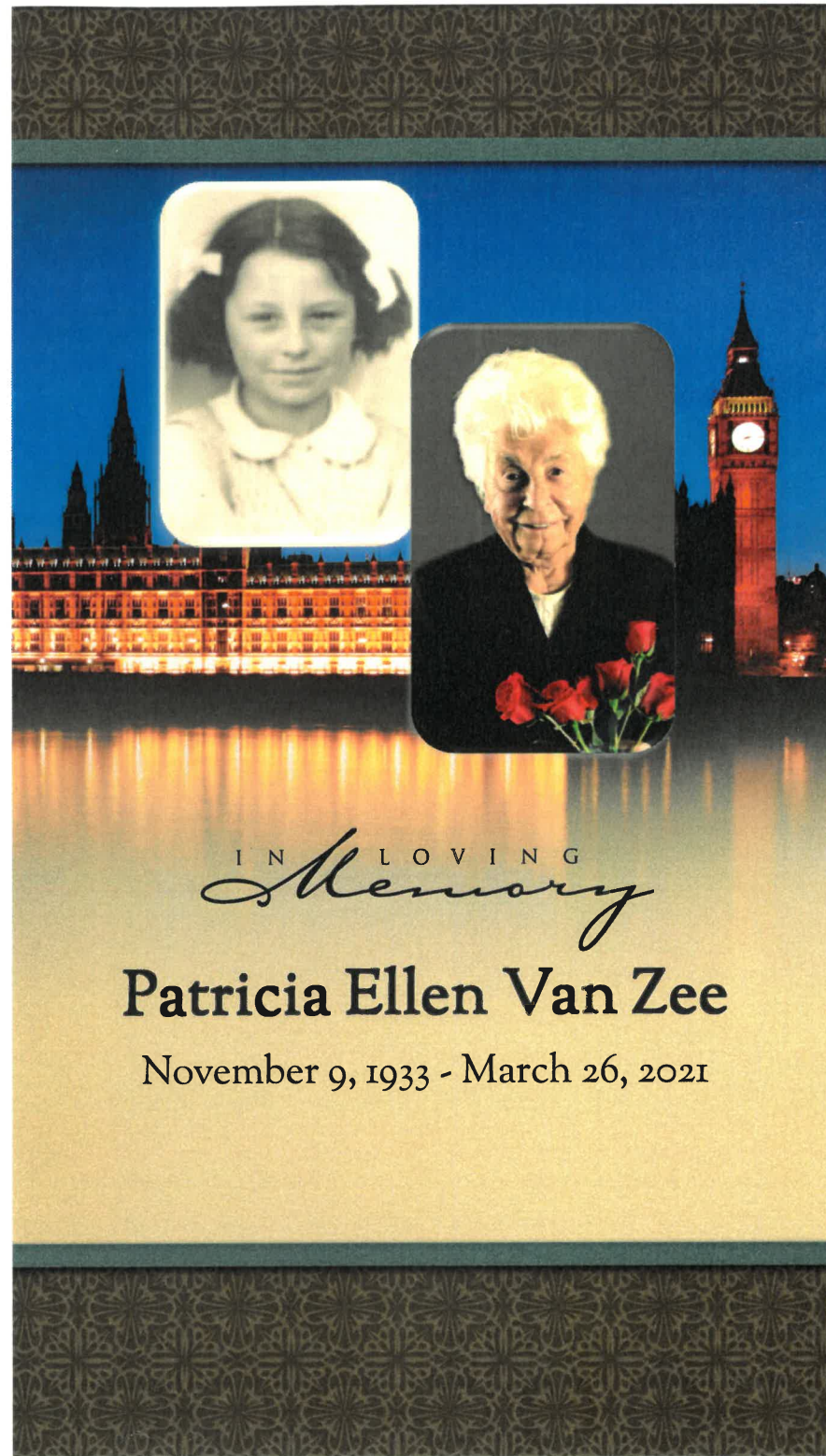

She taught at Spring Lake rural Hand County country school from August 1975 to 1979. Then she taught Special Education in Miller, South Dakota until her retirement.

Pat was a very talented lady, and it shows in and around her home. Her living room walls are covered with her beautiful counted cross stitch and family pictures. She was generous and many family members and friends were happy to have received her gifts.

She loved spending many hours working in her yard with her pretty flowers and garden. She was always found baking, cooking, canning, freezing, and making pies from the apples off her trees.
