

Scott Oligmueller, 59, of St. Lawrence, passed away Wednesday, March 8, 2023, at his home surrounded by family.

Scott Alan was born May 27, 1963, in Huron, South Dakota to Fred and Bev (Hanks) Oligmueller. Scott attended school in St. Lawrence until 8th grade and then attended Miller High School, graduating in 1981. He then furthered his education at South Dakota State University, graduating in 1986 with an Animal Science degree. After graduation, he returned to the farm working alongside his dad and uncles.

On September 10, 1988, he married Brenda Jensen in Chamberlain, South Dakota. To this union, three daughters were born: Heather, Paige, and Rachel. Scott and Brenda made their life together farming and ranching. In 2008, he took over the farm from his father. He was a very humble man, but prided himself on the farm he was able to build and his extensive knowledge in running his feedlot.
