

To Those I Love And Those Who Love Me


When I am gone, release me, let me go,

But now it's time I traveled on alone.


So grieve a while for me, if grieve you must;

Sharon Ann Ross, 80, of St. Lawrence, passed away Wednesday, March 20, 2024, at her daughter's home, surrounded by her family.

Sharon Ann was born July 26, 1943, to Vernon and Leona (Runge) Hedge in Tyler, Minnesota, the oldest of six children. The family moved to South Dakota near Wessington living on various farms. Sharon graduated from Wessington High School in 1961. There she met the love of her life, Ray Ross. They were married in 1962 at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Wessington.
