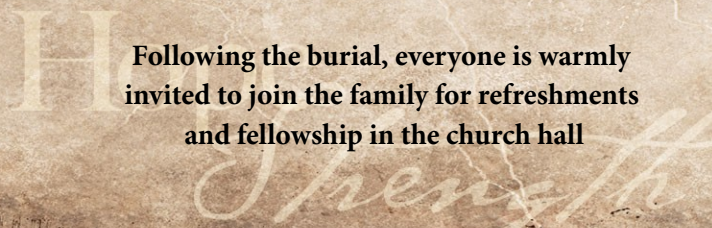

Margaret Moncur, 91, of Miller, passed away Wednesday, June 18, 2025, at Good Samaritan Society in Miller.
