Over the years, Violet and Melvin lived in several towns throughout South Dakota before building their home in Highmore, SD. Once her youngest child began school, Violet returned to teaching. She was not only dedicated to her family and career but also deeply involved in her community and church. Violet played the piano and organ for many years, taught Sunday school, and held numerous committee position including president of the United Methodist Women and president of the Church Board at the United Methodist Church in Highmore. She an active member of the Deed-a-Nite Extension Club, the American Legion Auxiliary, and the Hyde County Historical & Genealogical Society, where she recorded the genealogy of both her and Melvin's families.
